Annotation: History of Palm Island which opens with the Sorry time of 2004 when Mulrunji died in police custody; creation of magnetic Island and Palm Island by carpet snake; Manbarra and Buluguyban languages spoken on Island; Bwgcolman people are those people who have been sent to Palm Island; contact history; massacres. establishment of Hull River Reserve on the mainland under J. M. Kenny, an ex-policeman; setting up of a reserve on Palm Island after a cyclone at Hull River, under Superintendent Robert Henry Curry; Murriss and Torres Strait Islanders sent to Palm Island; Curry's rampage of February 1930; continued removals to Palm Island in 1930s and 40s, during which time there were eleven Superintendents; Ernest Gribble was the Anglican chaplain at the Island from 1930 to 1957 and provided some stability; deployment of 'mobile gangs' go cane fields, maize and corn crops of North Queensland alongside workers from Cherbourg, Yarrabah and Woorabinda and Italian internees during World War II; American troops, the Black Cat Squadron based on Palm Island for eighteen months during the war; Fantome Island; Roy Bartlam, ex-policeman, Superintendent in 1953 was renowned for his brutal control; 1957 Palm Island strike; 1960s Select Committee on Voting Rights heard evidence from Palm Islanders; death in custody of Henry Pitt in 1961; mistreatment of people on Palm Island in the 1960s and 1970s and deportation from Palm Island of those who spoke out against it; Palm Island Council; actions in the 1980s and 1990s to attempt to bring justice to Palm Islanders; concludes with the inquest into the death of Mulrunji in custody and its aftermath ISBN: 9780855757038 (pbk.)
