
THE ABORIGINAL TREATY COMMITTEE

In June 1979 we set out to convince Australians that a Treaty should be negotiated and signed by the Commonwealth Government and representatives of the Aboriginal people. In April the elected National Aboriginal Conference had asked for a Treaty.

The idea of a Treaty between people who are all citizens of one country is strange, but we believe it is understandable and necessary. The need is fully explained in a new book, 'It's Coming Yet', by Stewart Harris. The book, with 39 illustrations and a map, has been distributed by Angus and Robertson (Sydney and London) and retails for \$A6.95.

We suggest you buy it from your bookseller, but if this is difficult please send us \$7.50, to include postage within Australia.

We are organising regional committees, and seminars at several universities. We have sent letters to hundreds of organisations throughout Australia and we are placing advertisements like this one. We mean to influence opinion in every electorate, Federal and State. The work will be hard and success will not be quick. More than 1,000 sponsors have helped to pay to produce the book and our other activities.
